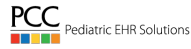

Coding Question #1

- Critical Care

"I have a question related to critical care. Patient presents to our office in respiratory distress and the physician spends 45+ minutes evaluating and stabilizing the patient. How do we code that?"



Coding Answer #1

E/M + critical care for time spent on:

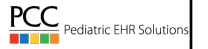
- Interp of cardiac output (CPT 93561, 93562)
- Pulse oximetry (CPT 94760, 94761, 94762)
- Chest x-rays, prof component (CPT 71010, 71015, 71020)
- Blood gases, data stored in computers (ECGs, BP, hematologic data -CPT 99090)



Coding Answer #1

E/M + critical care for time spent on (cont'd):

- Gastric intubation (CPT 43752, 43753)
- Transcutaneous pacing (CPT 92953)
- Vent management (CPT 94002-94004, 94660, 94662)
- Peripheral vascular access procedures (CPT 36000, 36410, 36415, 36591, 36600)

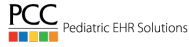


Total Duration of Critical Care Codes

less than 30 minutes	appropriate E/M codes
30-74 minutes (30 minutes - 1 hr, 14 min.)	99291 X 1
75-104 minutes (1 hr, 15 min. - 1 hr, 44 min.)	99291 X 1 AND 99292 X 1
105-134 minutes (1 hr, 45 min. - 2 hr, 14 min.)	99291 X 1 AND 99292 X 2
135-164 minutes (2 hr, 15 min. - 2 hr, 44 min.)	99291 X 1 AND 99292 X 3
165-194 minutes (2 hr, 45 min. - 3 hr, 14 min.)	99291 X 1 AND 99292 X 4
195 minutes or longer (3 hr, 15 min. - etc.)	99291 and 99292 as appropriate (see illustrated reporting examples above)

How would we bill for training on and sending a patient home with a Biliblanket?

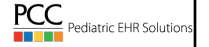


Coding Answer #2

The supply: HCPCS - E0202 Phototherapy (bilirubin) light with photometer

The training: 98960 - Education and training for patient self-management by a qualified, nonphysician health care professional using a standardized curriculum, face-to-face with the patient (could include caregiver/family) each 30 minutes; individual patient

*This code requires a standardized curriculum be used and must be at least 16 minutes of education

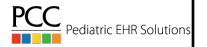
Code to Consider

Code to Consider

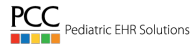
- Z00.110 Health examination for newborn under 8 days old

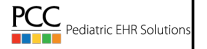

July Vaccines

- 90620 Meningococcal recombinant protein and outer membrane vesicle vaccine, serogroup B (**MenB-4C**), 2 dose schedule, for intramuscular use
- 90621 Meningococcal recombinant lipoprotein vaccine, serogroup B (**MenB-FHbp**), 2 or 3 dose schedule, for intramuscular use
- 90651 Human papillomavirus vaccine types 6, 11, 16, 18, 31, 33, 45, 52, 58, nonavalent (9vHPV), 2 or 3 dose schedule, for intramuscular use

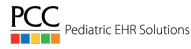

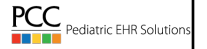
