Medicaid Incentive Program Eligibility

- Must be an "Eligible Professional" (EP)
 - Physicians (M.D., D.O.)
 - Nurse practitioners
- PAs not eligible
- Maximum 6 years of eligibility





Medicaid Incentive Program

- PCC EHR is currently 2014-edition certified
- Stage 3 reporting and 2015-edition certified EHR product is required starting in 2019 program year
- Incentive program is expected to expire after 2021





ONC Proposed Changes

- ONC has recently proposed changes to 2015-edition certification criteria.
- These changes are expected to be finalized in Fall 2019 and will define requirements for 2020 and beyond
 - PCC is anxiously awaiting these finalized changes which will include:
 - •Updated criteria
 - •Updated testing protocols
 - •Voluntary certification of health IT for pediatric care





ONC Proposed Pediatric Recommendations

ONC RECOMMENDATIONS FOR PEDIATRIC HEALTH IT VOLUNTARY CERTIFICATION CRITERIA

- 1. Use biometric-specific norms for growth curves and support growth charts for children
- 2. Compute weight-based drug dosage
- 3. Ability to document all guardians and caregivers
- 4. Segmented access to information
- 5. Synchronize immunization histories with registries

- 6. Age- and weight-specific single dose range checking
- 7. Transferrable access authority
- 8. Associate mother's demographics with newborn
- 9. Track incomplete preventative care opportunities
- 10. Flag special health care needs

ONC CERTIFICATION CRITERIA TO SUPPORT PEDIATRIC CARE AND PRACTICE SETTINGS

- ONC proposed ten recommendations for the voluntary certification of health IT for pediatric care
- More details about these criteria are expected in the final ruling to be released this Fall

2015E Development



- Tracking sexual orientation and gender identity
- Additional race and ethnicity options
- Tracking Unique Device Identifiers (UDIs) associated with a patient's implantable devices (i.e., pacemakers, cochlear implants, insulin pumps)



Care Coordination

- CCDA v2.1 update
- Data exports
- Direct Secure Messaging Updates
- Update to new version for Continuity of Care Document (CCDA), including parsing and validating
- Allow for expanded CCDA data export capabilities
 - Specified date range
- Updated back-end formatting for Direct Secure Messages



CQMs

- Updated pediatric measures and value sets
- QRDA version updates

- Updates to pediatric Clinical Quality Measures and value sets
- Updates to CQM export format (QRDA) and content



CQMs

Here are some other pediatric CQMs that PCC will consider adding (in addition to updating existing CQMs):

- Child and Adolescent Major Depressive Disorder (MDD): Suicide Risk Assessment
- Closing the Referral Loop: Receipt of Specialist Report
- Maternal Depression Screening
- Preventive Care and Screening: Influenza Immunization
- Children receiving fluoride varnish

Public Health

- Bi-directional Imms Registry
- Syndromic Surveillance Registry

- Bi-directional imms registry capability will be coming in 2020
- PCC plans to test for at least one additional public health reporting objective:
 - Syndromic surveillance registry
 - Cancer registry
 - Reporting to other public health agencies



Patient Engagement

- Patient API
- Patient portal view, download, and transmit updates

- Patient API
 - Allowing patients to have access to their own health data using the application of their choosing
 - Example: patients may wish to import data into their Apple Health app from their iPhone
- Patients can email summary of care via patient portal (in addition to sending via DSM)



Privacy /
Security•Updates to logging and reporting of auditable
events

• Includes logging and reporting of user admin changes (new users, disabled users, role changes, etc)
