# Pediatric BMI Diagnoses - 120% and beyond...

Clinical Record	SNOMED	ICD
Vitals Conditions / Problems	WIDE Variety	Z68.5_---







## One code for DOS up through 9/30/24

### **Z68.54**

Body mass index [BMI]  
pediatric, greater than or  
equal to 95th percentile for  
age



## THREE codes for DOS 10/1/24 and beyond...

**Z68.54** Body mass index [BMI]  
pediatric, 95th percentile for  
age to less than 120% of the  
95th percentile for age

**Z68.55** ... 120% of the 95th  
percentile - <140% of the 95th  
percentile...

**Z68.56** ... greater than or equal  
to 140% of the 95th percentile  
for age





# What do we do now?

## PCC is working to:

1. Address material ICD descriptor modifications.
2. Develop process to identify subset of encounters pre 10/1/24 where Z68.54 was coded AND the patient's BMI was greater than 120% of the 95th percentile for their age.
3. Discover best course to address contradiction in encounter records.



# What can you do?

## Practices:

1. Use diagnosis mapping to offer the best, most current choices at TOS
  - a. Run the **snomedmap** report to identify the affected mappings
2. Be aware that encounters where the patient's pediatric BMI is greater than 120% of 95th percentile before 10/1/24 need explanation if Z68.54 was assigned.
