The practice's administrator, Vladimir Varadi (Dr. Varadi's husband), speaks Russian, Estonian and German. Staff members are from Russia, Estonia, India, Mexico, Panama and Ireland. A part-time nurse practitioner is African American and she also speaks Spanish. The group represents three different religions.

> The diversity of the team is intentional, says Dr. Varadi, as the patients they serve in Charleston, S.C., reflect a multitude of backgrounds and life experiences.

"It's always been my goal to be able to serve as large and diverse of a community as I can," says Dr. Varadi. "Especially a community that may otherwise be






# COVID Vaccinated to date






# COVID vaccine by Race





